The Hon'ble Minister expressed keen interest in these initiatives and reaffirmed the state government's commitment to promoting Chhattisgarh's rich cultural heritage and artisanal crafts on the global platform.

On the same day, Dr. Rakesh Kumar, Director General, in the role of Chief Mentor, EPCH and Chairman, IEML; Dr. Neeraj Khanna, Chairman, EPCH; Mr. Avdhesh Agarwal, Chief Convenor, EPCH, met with Smt. Salini Singh Rajput, Chairman, Chhattisgarh Handicrafts Development Board, with the shared objective of shaping a more promising and sustainable future for the artisans of the state.

The interaction focused on empowering primary producers of Chhattisgarh's rich tribal crafts and textiles by forging stronger linkages between traditional heritage and global markets. Emphasis was laid on improving market access, capacity building and integration with international sourcing platforms, thereby ensuring that the skilled artisans who uphold the state's vibrant cultural legacy receive due economic recognition and meaningful business growth.

The delegation also called on Ms. Lata Usendi, National Vice President of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and MLA for Kondagaon, in Raipur. She previously served as the Minister of Women and Child Development in Chhattisgarh.

The discussion focused on a future strategy to develop and promote tribal handicrafts from Chhattisgarh and its neighbouring regions. Ms. Usendi's leadership in this initiative is significant due to her deep ties to the region's tribal heartland.

The Chhattisgarh state government has allocated significant funds in the 2025-26 budget for tribal welfare and rural connectivity through schemes like PM-JANMAN, which supports the infrastructure needed for tribal artisans to reach wider markets. Ms. Lata Usendi is also the Vice President of Bastar Development Board. The strategy discussed aligns with broader goals of building resilient infrastructure for artisans and fostering sustainable development through international market linkages.
